




Statistical Numbers 2021-2022









Table 2: Number of Participants per event





Table 4: Volunteer Numbers by Institution





Governance Code

- The IOHA are compliant with the Governance Code and our accounts are externally audited and have been accepted by Sport Ireland
- Our Gender ratio has unfortunately dropped from 33% to 20% due to the resignation of LH earlier in 2023
- Need to achieve 40% Female representation to satisfy Government and Sport Ireland requirements
- 3 external Board members (including a Treasurer) currently being recruited with the assistance of Board Match
- They will take up their positions in early 2024
- Engaging with Sport Northern Ireland to ensure continued recognition as the NGB for handball in NI

Miscellaneous

- 8 International Transfers completed in 2023
- 3 Juniors registering to play handball for the 1st time
- 5 Seniors leaving Ireland to register and play abroad. The IOHA did not request €150 transfer fee

Anti-Doping Report 2023

Key Points

- O The Irish Olympic Handball Association like all National Governing Bodies of sport in Ireland are subject to the Anti-Doping rules as laid out by Sport Ireland. Failure to achieve compliance with these rules means that the IOHA will not be eligible for funding from Sport Ireland or the relevant Government Department
- Irish handball players continue to remain outside
 Sport Ireland's Registered Testing Pool of athletes
- O IOHA Website is updated annually with up-todate regulations and other information
- All players and Coaches are encouraged to complete the Sport Ireland Anti-Doping elearning course. This online course is included on the curriculum of the Level 1 and Level 2 coaching awards

Key Points

The course covers key topics in anti-doping including the following:

- Anti-doping rule violations
- Testing procedures for blood and urine
- O How to check medications
- Therapeutic Use Exemptions
- The risk of supplements and herbal remedies
- Consequences of doping
- At the very end, a certificate of completion will be generated which all athletes and coaches are encouraged to save for their own records
- New World Anti-Doping Agency rules will come into effect on the 1st of January 2024 and if anyone wants this information, I can forward it to them
- The International Handball Federation (IHF) and European Handball Federation (EHF) websites both now have a comprehensive Anti-Doping section

IHF/EHF Anti-Doping Update 2023

The EHF position

- 10.1 The EHF Anti-Doping Unit (EAU) shall deal with the organization and handling of antidoping activities in handball in Europe (controls, non-intentional doping, education for young athletes, NADAs, medical exemptions (TUEs), whereabouts, violations, etc.)
- 10.2. The unit shall consist of a chairperson nominated by the EHF Executive Committee and an EHF office staff member
- 10.3. Further members may be nominated by the EHF Executive Committee
- O 10.4. Anti-doping measures are implemented on the basis of the EHF Regulations for Anti-doping. The EHF Regulations for Anti-Doping shall be in compliance with the WADA Code and the IHF Anti-Doping Regulations
- The responsibility regarding decisions on the EHF Regulations for Anti-Doping shall be with the EHF Executive Committee

IHF/EHF Anti-Doping Update 2023 cont.

- In 2022 the EHF carried out 484 tests
- Men's National Team Competitions 36/21 (In competition tests/ out of competition test)
- Women's National Team Competitions 24/21
- Men's Club Competitions 112 Women's Club Competitions 112
- Beach Handball. 76 tests. Younger Age Category Events M10 W72

Both the IHF and EHF have stepped up their activity in 2023 around Anti-Doping Education, with the IHF hosting a number of webinars for all involved in handball while the EHF held a seminar for National Federation Anti-Doping Officers.

Sport Ireland Anti-Doping Update

Since 2014, WADA has invited athletes, National and Regional Anti-Doping Organizations, Sports Federations, Governments, Major Event Organizers and all other anti-doping stakeholders worldwide to join the Agency's social media campaign to celebrate 'Play True Day' - a day that is traditionally dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of Clean Sport among athletes, the public and others. April 14th 2024.

Sport Ireland Anti-Doping Update cont.

Did you know?

 All medications, be they over-the-counter or prescription, may contain substances that are on the WADA Prohibited list. This list contains the details off all substances and methods that are prohibited in sport. The prohibited list is revised on an annual basis

Advice for Athletes

- •The simple advice for all athletes is that they MUST CHECK the status in sport of all medication BEFORE CONSUMING it. Athletes can now check the status in sport of medication purchased in the Republic of Ireland via the NEW Medicine Checker website below

Branding / re-Branding

Key Points

IOHA commissioned the agency 'Image Now' to do a Brand Audit and Strategic Review which included:

- Identity Audit (Identity, Name, Logo, Website, Social Media, Videos, Educational Resources)
- Competitive Analysis
- Surveys and Interviews
- 15-year Strategic Marketing Plan

Identity Audit – Key Findings

- The <u>current identity</u> of IOHA feels <u>outdated</u> and <u>disconnected</u>, dating back to the 70s. A rebranding opportunity arises to engage communities, modernize the brand, and target new audiences.
- The <u>name IOHA</u> is often <u>misinterpreted</u>, and a new name or rebranding can help clarify its association with Olympic handball.
- The <u>color scheme</u> feels <u>dull</u> and should be updated for digital platforms.
- The <u>identity lacks inclusivity</u>, especially for wheelchair handball representation.
- The **typefaces/fonts** do not align with the pictogram, and there is a <u>lack</u> of consistency in color options found online.

Overall, the identity needs improvement to better represent the organization, clubs, and countries it serves.



Surveys – Key Points

It was carried out surveys with the Players and Coaches, Sporting Organizations & Board Members (*circa 60 responses). What we discussed:




